Congo Free State - Mols 1894 and 1900 issues

- 1000  1900, Congo Free State, gun license, form type C, it was only given to black "capita" (superior black native man of a private company), granted on November 16, 1900 in Kinshasa, to a Capita of the "Compagnie du Lomani" in Bena-Makima, district of Stanley Falls for a "fusil à piston" (=piston shotgun) with flag administrative "flag" cachet "DISTRICT DU STANLEY-POOL" in blue, paid with (2x) 10fr green - Mols 1898 issue perforation 14 1/4 and signed by the public officer, used as revenue stamps, the form was overprinted in red for a transfer to another place "Yanga" and for the same company, with pen note "fusil manquant à l'intendance - Karleel - 1er mai 1902" (Missing rifle from the quartermaster's office - Karleel - May 1, 1902), folded as usual, remarkable state of conservation, one of the most beautiful, great rarity of Congo Free State, with Lindekens certificate, very fine 1.200€



- 1001   ✉   1902, Congo Free State, picture postcard franked with 15c ochre - Mols 1897 issue, sent from Matadi November 19, 1902 to Meudon / France where it arrived December 19 and then forwarded to Arcachon (Dec. 20) where the stamp was again cancelled (very scarce), very fine 50 €
- 1002   ✉   1905, Congo Free State, picture postcard franked with 10c carmine - Mols 1900 issue, sent from Stanleyville July 24, 1905 to Aywaille in Belgium where it arrived September 20, 1905, via Leopoldville (Aug. 17), with "T" mark (taxe) of Congo crossed out, rate for postcard = 15c considered as printed matter (less than 5 words and sign), superb correction, scarce, very fine 40 €
